There were only 3 limits caught and only 7 of 11 teams weighed in fish. Jason and Buck started it off with a win with a limit of 15.62. Second went to Bud, Ed Byrd and Janice with 5 fish that went 13.52, and third place went to Frank Nugie, Josh and Patrick with 13.27. Big fish was caught by Dave Patrick 6.76 lbs. with Austin and Bill Shoemaker. Good job guys!



According to our approved tournament schedule, El Cap is the first point's tourney on Feb. 20. We will draw for partners at February's meeting. It is a launch and go, weigh in at 3pm next to the floating ranger/rental station. Please mark your big fish before getting in line, make sure there is adequate water in the bag to support all of your fish and have your weigh in slip completely filled out- including your name. After you weigh your fish you will be given them back to release. Please walk out to dock and put them in the deeper water, not from shore. If you need to deflate the fish do be for you bring them to the scale, this will greatly reduce the stress on the fish. Weigh in should go real smooth with the crack team we have compiled. Results will be read at the top by gazebo.

I am in the process of getting a variance. We should get one, and I do have local lake approval for all of our local lakes. The variance comes from DFG and this guy hasn't returned four of my calls. I might have to call Terry Foreman and sic him on this guy.

General Meeting Minutes
January 5, 2010**



President Smiling Ed Marr welcomed the Club with 17 smacks of the gavel and an inspiring message: "It's a new year - we're all in first place!" Randy Kreiser motioned to accept the minutes from last month's meeting; Jim Davis seconded. The minutes were then approved via voice vote. Ed encouraged everyone to volunteer at the various Club events throughout the year. He also asked if the group is interested in Guest Speakers. The hand vote was yes. In new business, Doris Cook reported that effective March you don't have to display your fishing license.

Membership Director Mike Lupo introduced guests Wendy Baird, Jen Rosner, & prospective member Josh Rhodes. Mike reported the Club is full, with 50 active members, and Josh is on the waiting list.

Marshall Bubel filled in as Treasurer for Frank Nuegebauer who was in Philadelphia for his father's funeral. Our sympathies go out to Frank and his family. Marshall emphasized how very important it is that every member pay up annual insurance, which is required to fish Club tournaments.

Zoé Gardner wrapped up 2009 business by presenting a new Loomis drop shot rod to Josh Buller for 8th place last year, calling him "the baddest back seater in the land". She also reported that approximately \$1,400 rolled over from last year to this year.

Tournament Director Keith Cloward reported that about 30 members attended the Tournament Planning Meeting and voted on the proposed schedule. Keith asked if anyone had suggested changes to the Tournament Rules. No one had changes. He also noted that each "Boater" is required to submit proof of insurance to him. Jim Putney requested that our night tournaments, which are the night before the Bass Council Night Tournaments, be changed. A show of hands among members who planned to fish both

Indicated that none had a problem with having our tournament the night before the Bass Council's. Even so, Jim got his wish for our August El Cap night event, which was changed from Aug 27 to Aug 20. The rest of the schedule proposed by the Tournament Committee was voted on and approved, with that one change.

On Saturday January 16, we'll do a fun fish at Diamond Valley. It will be a team tournament, launch & go, with a \$10 per person prize pool going to the first place team. 5 best fish per boat wins. Because there were more backseaters than boaters wishing to fish, some boats will have 3 people. Backseaters will pick up DVL fees, which are \$25 per boat for 2 people and a couple bucks more for 3 people in the boat. Keepers must be 15 inches. Gate swings at 6:45 am. Hemet resident Dave Patrick emphasized that DVL is a strict place: all motors must meet DVL standards, each boat must be inspected and get a MWD sticker, and boats must be completely dry. He said that if there is any moisture in the bilge, the drain hole, or the live well they won't let you on the lake. There is no smoking on the lake, and no speeding. Greg reported that in the last couple weeks he's caught fish in 50 feet on light, 10 lb line with 5/8 jigs or drop shot or Carolina rigged 6 inch worms on 6 lb line.

Next Month's Meeting: February 2, with Marshall Bubel speaking on his trip to Bacarrac, Mexico. Zoé and Doris to provide dessert.
